A SERIES OF CLIMATE AND JOBS CONVERSATIONS CONVENED BY THE CALIFORNIA WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD

The California Workforce Development Board (State Board) is hosting a series of ten consultations related to the [AB 398](#) workforce report, which will address labor market strategies to achieve the state's climate goals while ensuring that the benefits of a low-carbon economy accrue to all Californians.

The discussions are designed to help the State plan for economic and workforce development in the low-carbon economy emerging from the [Climate Change Scoping Plan](#), as directed by AB 398, and advanced through related clean economy initiatives like SB 350. How can California simultaneously advance equity, mobility, and job quality for workers; deliver skills and competitiveness for the state's best employers; and address the challenges of climate change throughout the economy?

The first five meetings will give the State Board a chance to hear from different *constituencies* on these issues; the second round will address them in relation to each of the Scoping Plan *sectors*. This targeted dialogue will supplement formal research for the report, inform its recommendations, and address implementation of the jobs and workforce elements of the SB 350 Low Income Barriers Report. 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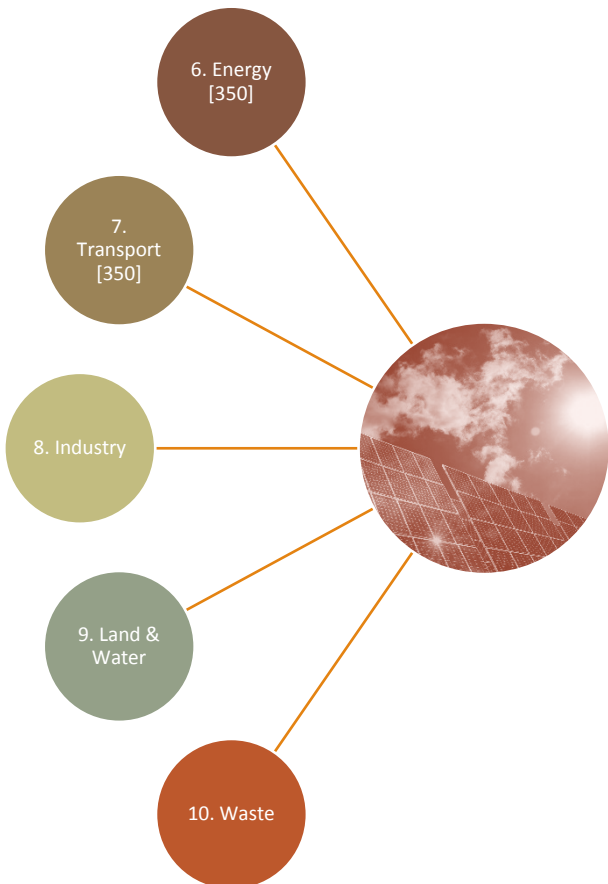
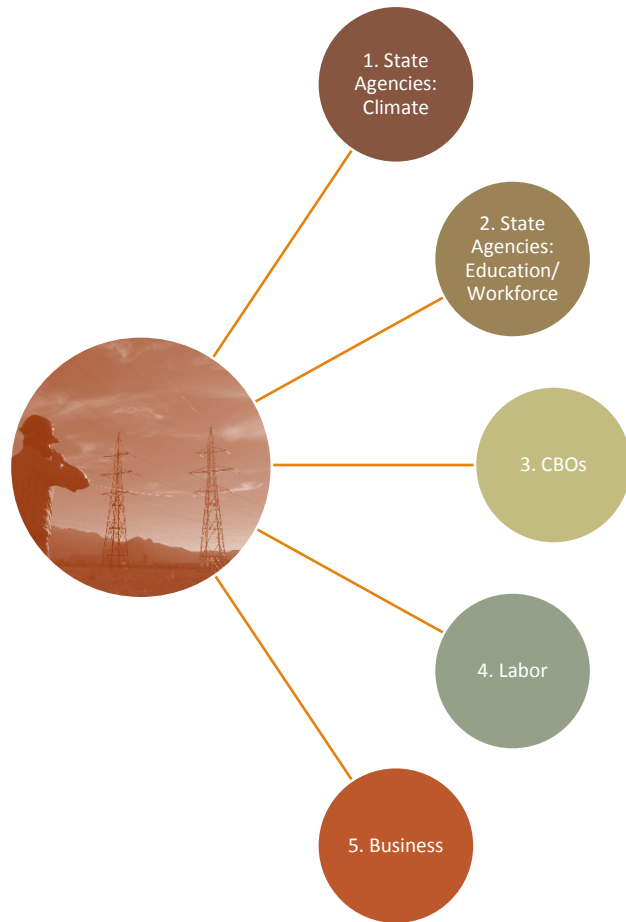
