#### **Future of Work Commission**

<u>HISTORY</u>: On International Workers' Day, Governor Newsom signed an <u>executive order (PDF)</u> establishing the Future of Work Commission. The overarching goal of the Future of Work Commission is to develop a new social compact for California workers, based on an expansive vision for economic equity that takes work and jobs as the starting point.

## Department of Better Jobs and Higher Wages Updates:

<u>HISTORY</u>: On Friday, January 10, Governor Gavin Newsom released the Proposed State Budget for Fiscal Year 2020 - 2021 which includes \$2.4 million in General Fund investment to establish the new department, the California Department of Better Jobs and Higher Wages. The new department is a consolidation of multiple workforce functions dispersed across the Labor and Workforce Development Agency into a new single department under a unified executive leadership and common policy vision.

- The new department would be comprised of the:
  - California Workforce Development Board (CWDB),
  - Employment Training Panel (ETP),
  - Employment Development Department
    - Workforce Services Branch (WSB)
    - Labor Market Information Division (LMID)
  - Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) (currently in the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR).

The goal of unifying these programs is to create more effectiveness and efficiency in serving Californians and their career goals, along with employers and their business needs.

**UPDATES:** As anticipated, when legislature reconvened, their primary focus is addressing the Unemployment Insurance needs, disaster relief, and not the new proposal.

## **Regional Plan Implementation**

- Formal guidance was sent out the week of June 15<sup>th</sup> for subgrant extensions, advising that:
  - o RPI 2.0 Three options:
    - 1. No extension needed
    - 2. Three month extension needed
    - 3. Six month extension needed
  - RPI 3.0 are all being automatically extended for 6 months.
- This will be an opportunity to make modifications to the subgrants as well.

## Prison to Employment (P2E)

- Successfully completed CalJOBS Refresher Training June 10-12, 2020.
  - The refresher training was intended for current and new staff, who work directly with participants and/or entering data in the CalJOBS system.
- P2E Program team is looking to resume their P2E Taskforce meetings with CDCR.
  - Taskforce meetings were postponed due to the urgent need to address and mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
- Formal guidance was sent out the week of June 15<sup>th</sup> and provided an opportunity to amend contracts.
- Contract term dates will not be offered at this time since contracts expire in March 2022 and the funding terms out in June 2022.
- P2E check-in calls for each RPU, will be scheduled for July and August.

## High Road: HRCC/SB1, HRTP, and Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF)

The Governor and Labor and Workforce Development Agency Secretary have a High Road vision for California's workforce system. They have identified five pillars of the High Road: Job Quality, Equity, Climate, Regionalism and Worker Voice. The State Board is currently implementing two initiatives that support this vision: High Road Construction Careers and High Road Training Partnerships

## **High Road Construction Careers (HRCC)/SB 1**

HISTORY: Building off of the pre-apprenticeship training partnerships developed under Prop 39, the HRCC: SB 1 program will expand HRCC into a comprehensive statewide industry sector strategy through the expansion, development and support of a single HRCC pre-apprenticeship partnership in each region of California. These regions are based on groupings of Building and Construction Trade Council jurisdictions and conduct themselves similar to State Plan Regional Planning Units. The goal of HRCC: SB 1 is to establish sustainable, regionally based pre-apprenticeship partnerships that systematically connect disadvantaged workers and communities to long-term middle-class careers through state-approved apprenticeship. The CWDB has up to \$14 million available for HRCC: SB 1 at this time.

- Information/Reports:
  - The SB 1 Workforce Guidelines are standards for pre-apprenticeship in the construction sector. Developed pursuant to SB 1, these construction preapprenticeship standards are applicable across industry segments, policy areas, and workforce investments. These guidelines can be found here:

## **High Road Training Partnerships (HRTP)**

<u>HISTORY</u>: There are currently eight (8) pilot projects (funded w/ WIOA discretionary funds) that model a sector approach that addresses critical issues of equity, job quality, and environmental sustainability. HRTPs are industry-based, worker-focused training partnerships that build skills for California's high road employers.

- In coordination with UC Berkeley Labor Center, the CWDB has been leading exclusive High Road events where current projects are sharing their implementation experience and strategies. Most recently, discussions have been around virtual learning and COVID-19 response strategies.
- Project adjustments, modifications and no-cost extensions related to COVID-19 are in progress.

### Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF): CA Climate Investment (CCI) Program

<u>HISTORY</u>: The CWDB received \$165 million from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF), (\$35 million annually starting in 19/20) to further invest in HRTP and HRCC. Program outcomes include:

- Strengthening existing and developing new high road training partnerships;
- Piloting two worker transition projects in sectors and regions facing mass worker dislocation in California;
- Creating at least 10 new state-approved apprenticeship programs, preparing at least 3,000 disadvantaged Californians for apprenticeship in the trades, and; Prioritizing Community Workforce Agreements and local hiring ordinances throughout the state of California.
  - The HRTP CCI RFA is under development with anticipated release in Summer 2020.
  - The HRCC CCI RFA is under development with anticipated release in Fall 2020.

## English Language Learner (ELL)

- EDD awarded \$1.35 million to provide training and job opportunities for English Language Learners.
- Four Local Workforce Development Boards were awarded that serve Colusa, Glenn, Madera, San Joaquin, Sutter, Ventura, and Yuba counties
- Will provide 460 ELL participants with increased access to effective training models, supportive services, and incorporate innovative employment strategies with partners to create career opportunities in growing industries.
