The Shirley Ware Education Center (SWEC) has been providing education and training to community members and healthcare workers since its formation in 1998. This project takes a comprehensive approach and acts as the bridge that connects the demand for quality jobs with the supply of workers supported through a program model that includes career planning, training, and job placement. These efforts drive outcomes that have a measurable impact on workers' lives and employers' needs, uplifting the communities in which they live and work while advancing climate resiliency.

Twelve full-service career pathways will provide workers with the skills, clinical experience and industry-recognized credentials that are required for movement into clinical and professional tech roles that pay family-sustaining wages and offer ample opportunity for ongoing advancement. Focusing on engagement of under-represented communities, informs the development of SWEC's programming and promotes equity in access to high-quality jobs and a clinical population that is reflective of California's diverse population.

- Offer fully supported career pathways to 497
 participants in the following job titles: Phlebotomy,
 Licensed Vocational Nurse, Respiratory Therapist,
 Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Sterile Processing with
 75% completion rate.
- Register 67 participants in five (5) apprenticeship programs in the following job titles: Medical Coder, Optical Dispenser, Orthopedic Technologist, Sterile Processing Technician, Surgical Technologist with 75% completion rate.
- 50% of program graduates will move into new jobs or earn higher wages within one year of completion.
- Offer tuition support programming to 424 participants at institutions and job classifications of their choosing with a 75% completion rate.
