## STATE WORKFORCE BOARD ANNOUNCES \$28.5 MILLION TO SUPPORT HEALTHCARE SECTOR TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT FOR UNDERSERVED WORKERS

The High Road Training Partnership Healthcare Grant prioritizes partnerships focused on connecting workers to high-quality, middle-skill jobs in the Healthcare sector.

**SACRAMENTO, CA**—The California Workforce Development Board (CWDB) and the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency (LWDA) today announced the availability of up to \$28.5 million in grant funding for the High Road Training Partnerships (HRTP) 2024-25 Healthcare Grant Program

This cycle of the HRTP grant program extends the state's commitment to advancing job quality, economic equity, and climate resilience for all Californians, and will focus on funding training partnerships that increase the number of new workers in quality jobs in the healthcare sector. The HRTP grant program is part of the Workforce for a Healthy California initiative and is aligned with Governor Gavin Newsom's Jobs First strategy.

Qualifying projects will lead to jobs that pay good wages, offer opportunities for career advancement, and create or strengthen pathways to economic security and upward mobility. Applicants should propose innovative and accessible opportunities to recruit, train, hire, and advance an ethnically and culturally inclusive healthcare workforce with improved diversity and higher wages.

Since 2022, the State of California has invested more than \$85 million in 23 HRTP healthcare projects statewide – part of Governor Gavin Newsom's larger push to adequately prepare people for fulfilling careers in high-growth sectors of the economy. The HRTP projects already

funded will serve a projected 12,420 participants, helping them gain valuable skills and accreditation to secure, well -paying jobs. In total, the HRTP investments are expected to total \$106 million by the end of 2026 – serving 14,700 participants.

HRTP HC will fund healthcare projects in three stages of project readiness: Planning and Development, Training Implementation, and Expanding. The funding range is between \$500K and \$5 million, depending on the type of project and its duration. All projects must incorporate High Road principles to create good-paying jobs, address economic disparities, and support California's transition to a clean energy economy.
